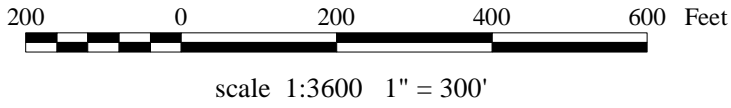
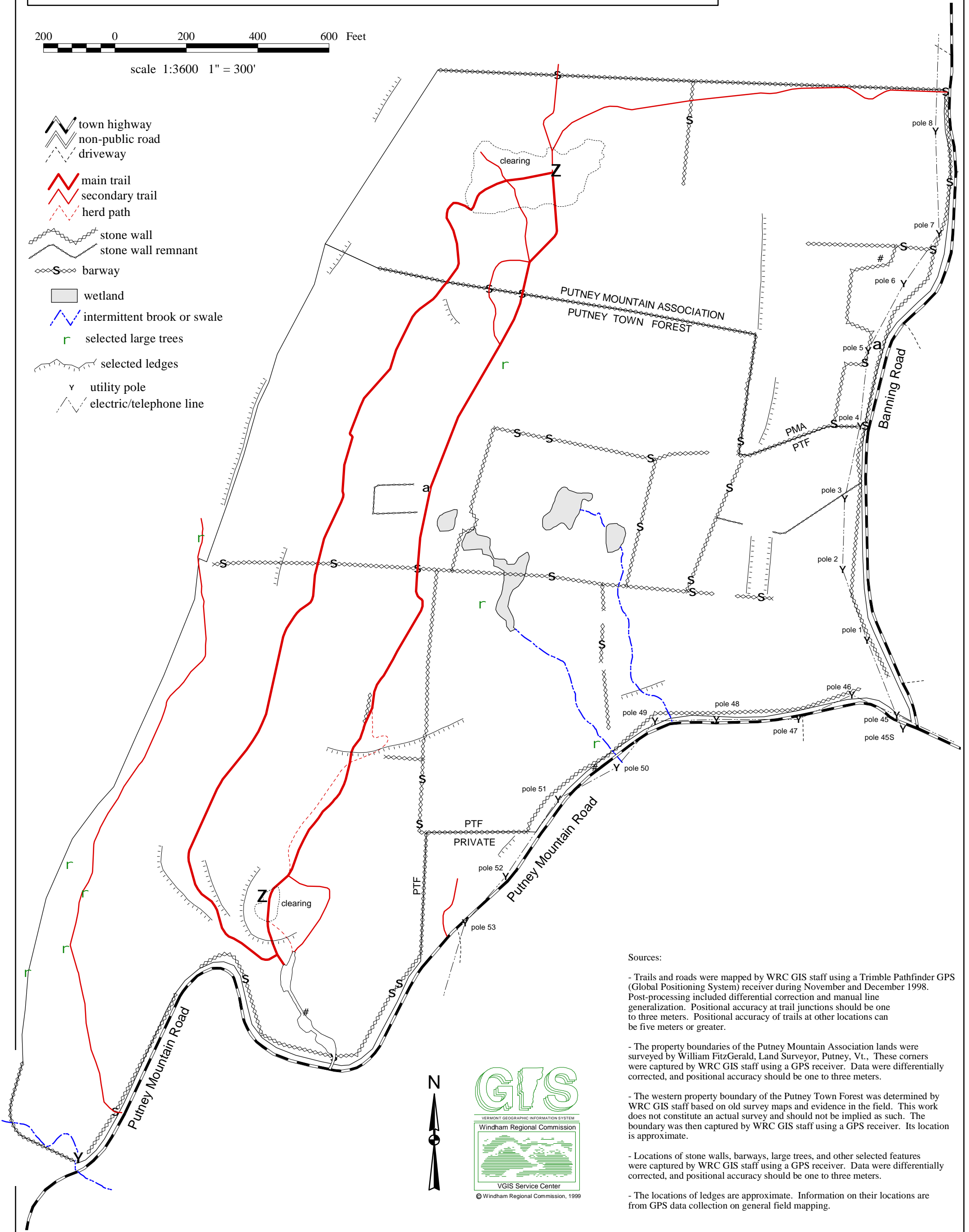


# The Putney Town Forest and Putney Mountain Association lands

- Trails and roads were mapped by WRC GIS staff using a Trimble Pathfinder GPS (Global Positioning System) receiver during November and December 1998. Post-processing included differential correction and manual line generalization. Positional accuracy at trail junctions should be one to three meters. Positional accuracy of trails at other locations can be five meters or greater.
- The property boundaries of the Putney Mountain Association lands were surveyed by William FitzGerald, Land Surveyor, Putney, Vt.. These corners were captured by WRC GIS staff using a GPS receiver. Data were differentially corrected, and positional accuracy should be one to three meters.
- The western property boundary of the Putney Town Forest was determined by WRC GIS staff based on old survey maps and evidence in the field. This work does not constitute an actual survey and should not be implied as such. The boundary was then captured by WRC GIS staff using a GPS receiver. Its location is approximate.
- Locations of stone walls, barways, large trees, and other selected features were captured by WRC GIS staff using a GPS receiver. Data were differentially corrected, and positional accuracy should be one to three meters.
- The locations of ledges are approximate. Information on their locations are from GPS data collection on general field mapping.
